#### **SPEAKER**

#### ROBERT M. O'NEIL

#### Founding Director Thomas Jefferson Center for the Protection of Free Expression

In August 1990, after serving five years as president of the University of Virginia, Robert M. O'Neil became the founding director of the Thomas Jefferson Center for the Protection of Free Expression. The center is widely known for its Jefferson Muzzles that are handed out each year to groups and individuals the center believes have forgotten "Mr. Jefferson's admonition that freedom of speech cannot be limited without being lost."

O'Neil continues as a member of the university's law faculty, teaching courses in free speech and press, free expression and the arts, free speech and cyberspace, and other areas of constitutional law.

After serving as law clerk to Supreme Court Justice William J. Brennan, Jr., O'Neil in 1963 began three decades of teaching at the Universities of California (Berkeley), Cincinnati, Indiana, Wisconsin and Virginia. In addition to teaching, he held administrative posts at the University of Cincinnati, Indiana University and the University of Wisconsin before coming to Virginia.

He has chaired the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges, and served on the executive committee of the Association of American Universities. In Virginia he served as a trustee and former president of the Council for America's First Freedom and as the first president of Virginia's Coalition for Open Government.

He is the author of several books, including *Free Speech: Responsible Communication Under Law, The Rights of Public Employees, Classrooms in the Crossfire* and *Free Speech in the College Community.* He has testified before state legislatures and Congressional committees on the First Amendment implications of proposed legislation.

A member of the Massachusetts Bar, O'Neil has argued cases before a number of Federal Courts of Appeals. The Boston native holds three degrees from Harvard and honorary degrees from Beloit College and Indiana University.

#### SPEAKER FOR THE GRADUATES

#### Jonathan Henry Cavendish Atkins *Certificate, Surgical Technology*

Jonathan Atkins, who today formally receives his certificate in surgical technology, actually completed his studies last August and has since been on the job in the obstetrics department at Martha Jefferson Hospital.

This new career in the medical field is vastly different from the one Jonathan pursued earlier in his working life—that of a lace designer for textile firms in England, Brazil and the United States. That career, including 15 years with Liberty Fabrics in Gordonsville, ended when worldwide shifts in the textile industry caused the factory to close.

Because the closing was linked to the North American Free Trade Act (NAFTA), the federal government paid for Jonathan's second trip to college (the first was art college in the United Kingdom). And after years of working with fabric and machines, he knew that he wanted to work with people.

He found going back to school a real adventure. The returning student was pleased to discover that his verbal skills and thought processes improved as he mastered the material necessary to assist the surgeon in an operating room.

His schooling overlapped with that of his daughter, Ashley, who graduated from Emory and Henry last year. Jonathan and his wife, Deborah, a speech and language pathologist in the Madison County Schools, also are the parents of Ian, a William and Mary graduate who is working as a videographer.

# SASHA WHITE Associate in Arts, Liberal Arts, 2003-2005

Sasha White learned about community colleges from her parents, Ramona Hood-White and Peter White, both of whom began their baccalaureate study at two-year colleges.

So it is perhaps not surprising that upon her graduation from Covenant School in 2003, Sasha would enroll at PVCC on her way to the University of Virginia. What is unusual about Sasha, and what has earned her designation as PVCC's 2005 Distinguished Student, is her love of learning and the ways in which she shared that quality with other students at the college.

As an intern this year with English Professor Emeritus Dick Harrington, Sasha has worked with his students in developmental and college English, sharing office hour responsibilities and working with students one-on-one or in groups. This tutoring environment is very familiar to Sasha, who has been a summer German tutor for UVa athletes since 2003.

An honors program participant, Sasha also was cited for her campus leadership. She serves this year as president of the PVCC chapter of PTK, is a student representative on the collegewide committee planning the new science and technology building, and was part of a PVCC delegation to the General Assembly session earlier this year.

When she enrolled at PVCC she was certain she would study to be a professor of German. A PVCC psychology class got her thinking about a dual major in German and psychology and possible graduate study in language processing. Whether her path leads to the classroom or to research, Sasha will always have fond memories of PVCC and the "wonderful, seasoned professors" she has encountered here.

# SHARON R. BRAGG Associate in Applied Science Nursing, 1992

Sharon Bragg, clinical coordinator for the Medical Intensive Care Unit at the University of Virginia Health System, is honored today as the recipient of the 2005 Distinguished Alumni Award. Established in 1998, the award highlights the significant roles PVCC alumni are playing in Central Virginia and beyond.

Ms. Bragg represents well the adult student who comes to PVCC for a second career. After her graduation from Albemarle High School in 1979, she worked for a dozen years as a hair stylist, learning her craft on the job. She also was a community volunteer, logging hours with the Charlottesville Albemarle Rescue Squad.

So when she decided to explore career options, her rescue interests and her knowledge of her husband Robert's work (he is a captain with the Charlottesville Fire Department) led her in the direction of nursing.

After 13 years at UVa, first in the Burn Center and later in the Medical Intensive Care Unit, and with a bachelor's degree in nursing from Eastern Mennonite University to her credit, Ms. Bragg says the rewards of being a nurse remain the same. "You know you've helped somebody every day," she says. "Whether you are working at the bed-side of a patient or as an administrator making life better for the staff, you know you're making a difference."

Twelve years ago, the Braggs started the Central Virginia Burn Camp, a one-week summer camp for children between the ages of 7 and 17 who have been admitted to the hospital for treatment of a burn injury. Although they have not been directly involved with the camp for two years, Ms. Bragg views the program as part of her legacy of service to her community.

Honors Diplomas are awarded to students who have completed 15 credit hours of honors courses and have a GPA of 3.5 or above.

Graduates wearing a gold stole and tassel are members of the Alpha Epsilon Tau chapter of Phi Theta Kappa, the international honor society for two-year colleges. The silk honors stole and tassel are worn by graduating PTK members as a symbol of their outstanding academic achievement.

Because the list of names must be furnished to the printer in final form 10 days prior to graduation, it is possible that one or more of the candidates listed may have been unable to complete all requirements for a certificate, diploma or degree. Inability to remove a name before printing the program does not commit the college to grant a certificate, diploma or degree to a person listed. Similarly, receipt of a Summer 2005 degree, diploma or certificate listed in the program is contingent upon completion of the necessary requirements.

# OLD DOMINION UNIVERSITY 2004-2005 GRADUATES

Since the fall of 1994, a partnership between PVCC and Old Dominion University in Norfolk has provided Central Virginia students the opportunity to complete a baccalaureate degree without leaving the PVCC campus. #### THE ACADEMIC REGALIA

The history of academic dress reaches back to medieval universities, where the gown, the cap, and the hood signified the privileges and responsibilities of the scholar. The teaching guild was the guild of the master of arts; the bachelor was the apprentice of the master.

At Cambridge and Oxford universities, every detail of academic dress is subject to regulation by the university. At one time, Oxford tailors who did not comply with the rules could be punished by the vice chancellor of the university. European universities continue to show great diversity in academic dress. American colleges and universities, however, have followed a single standard of academic dress since 1895.

The gown has become a symbol of the democracy of scholarship as it covers dress indicating rank or social standing. Bachelor's and master's degree gowns have no trimming; the doctor's degree gown is faced with velvet and has velvet bars on the sleeves in colors to show the faculty or discipline to which the degree pertains.

The cap symbolizes freedom of scholarship. The symbol derives from Roman times when freed slaves had the privilege of wearing a cap. Academic caps feature a tassel indicating the discipline of the wearer.

The hood is the forerunner to the present cap. Its colors denote the discipline represented by the degree, and the college or university from which the degree was granted.

#### THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The Piedmont Virginia Community College mace was presented to the college by University of Virginia President Robert M. O'Neil in 1988. The gift honored PVCC President George B. Vaughan as he prepared to leave the college and also signified the close working relationship that had developed between the two institutions.

The mace is a traditional ceremonial staff which serves as a symbol of authority. The PVCC mace is made of silver and walnut and incorporates a Jefferson cup into its design. It was created by John J. Owen, retired vice president for development at the University of Virginia.

#### **PVCC MEDALLION**

The Piedmont Virginia Community College Medallion is awarded to persons who, through special acts or sustained service, have made extraordinary contributions to PVCC. The Medallion is the highest non-academic honor the college bestows. Recipients are:
