# SPEAKER

### KATHERINE C. THORNTON Educator and Former Astronaut

After traveling more than 16 million miles in space, Kathryn C. Thornton accepted a new mission at the University of Virginia as a professor and assistant dean in the School of Engineering and Applied Science and director of the Center for Science, Mathematics, and Engineering Education. The goal of the center is to promote excellence in science, mathematics, and technology education at all levels in Virginia's public schools.

Selected by NASA in May 1984, Dr. Thornton is a veteran of four space flights between 1989 and 1995. She has logged more than 975 hours in space, including more than 21 hours of extravehicular activity (the women's record for number and duration). She was a crew member for the maiden flight of the space shuttle Endeavor and her repair work in space included the Hubble Space Telescope. While serving as an astronaut, Dr. Thornton was also head of the NASA Johnson Space Center Education working group which coordinated the educational outreach activities of astronauts and professional educators working under the "Teaching from Space" contract with Oklahoma State University.

In addition to her duties at the University of Virginia, Dr. Thornton serves as a member of the National Research Council Aeronautics and Space Engineering Board and the U.S. Air Force University Board of Visitors. Her honors and awards include NASA's Distinguished Service Medal, Space Flight Medal, and Exceptional Service Medal. As part of the Hubble Space Telescope repair team, she in 1994 received the National Aeronautic Association Robert J. Collier Trophy, which is awarded annually for the greatest achievement in aviation.

Prior to becoming an astronaut, Dr. Thornton was employed as a physicist at the U.S. Army Foreign Science and Technology Center in Charlottesville. She has a bachelor's degree from Auburn University and earned master's and doctoral degrees in physics from the University of Virginia. She is married to Stephen T. Thornton, Ph.D., also a professor at the University of Virginia. They reside in Charlottesville with three daughters and a dog.

# SPEAKER FOR THE GRADUATES

### VIRGINIA LOUISE HILL Associate in Arts, Liberal Arts Summa cum laude

Virginia L. Hill today receives an associate in arts degree in liberal arts. She is graduating with highest academic honors.

Miss Hill moved to Charlottesville from Maine in 1995. She began her career at PVCC with a public speaking course. So satisfied was she with the success of the course in helping her to be more comfortable when speaking in front of people that she returned for a math course and discovered that she really liked math. From these initial experiences with supportive professors a full program of study developed which culminates today with the associate degree.

While at PVCC, Ms. Hill has immersed herself in the life of the college. She has challenged herself academically with four semesters of honors program courses. She was selected for membership in the college's Alpha Epsilon Tau chapter of Phi Theta Kappa and was a member of the student committee that interviewed candidates during PVCC's most recent presidential selection process. She has enriched PVCC's music program as a member of the PVCC Chorus and has performed six of her musical compositions for the public or classmates.

New students benefit from her experience through her presentations in the "Adults Returning to School" orientation course. This spring, theater-goers saw her on stage in PVCC's production of *Spoon River Anthology*. And beyond campus, eighth-graders at Buford Middle School found her love of math contagious when she tutored them as part of her service learning.

Having reached the milestone of an associate degree, Ms. Hill looks forward to continuing her baccalaureate study at the University of Virginia this fall. She will pursue her interests in music, math, and religion. After three years of study, she will graduate from the Curry School of Education with a master's degree in education.

# DISTINGUISHED STUDENT AWARD RECIPIENT

### AMBER N. CAPRON Associate in Arts, Liberal Arts Summa cum laude

Amber N. Capron, a member of the PVCC Class of 2000, has distinguished herself through scholarship and service. A student in the college's honors program, she graduates today with a perfect 4.0 grade point average.

A professor who knows Ms. Capron from five classes, praises her extraordinary intelligence which is manifested in verbal and written eloquence. Ms Capron embodies the Buddhist goal of a "pure heart and enlightened mind," the professor says.

But Ms. Capron's legacy is more than that of a stellar student. The service learning projects she has completed will provide a continuing reminder that she was a student here. The bulbs she planted and the landscaping she undertook around the ornamental pond at the north entrance will beautify the campus for years to come.

Service has been key to Ms. Capron's PVCC experience. In fact, it kept her here long after she might have chosen to transfer to a four-year college or university. Her service has extended to the larger community including two elementary schools. At Stony Point Elementary School, the school she once attended, she has volunteered several hours a week in a first grade class. At Peabody School, she has worked with kindergartners, reading to them and helping them with math.

The student body at PVCC benefited from Ms. Capron's service this spring as she helped to organize a public information campaign that culminated in two days of AIDS awareness programming on campus.

Ms. Capron plans to continue her studies at the University of Virginia, pursuing her varied interests in philosophy, law, and environmental science.

# DISTINGUISHED STUDENT AWARD RECIPIENT

### SAMUEL A. TAYLOR, JR. Associate in Science, Science Magna cum laude

Samuel A. Taylor, Jr., a member of the PVCC Class of 2000, is a scholar and a student leader. His unique combination of talent and service was recognized earlier this year when the college nominated him to the All-USA Community College Academic Team sponsored by *USA Today* and Phi Theta Kappa, the national honor society for two-year colleges.

Mr. Taylor is an experienced student, having graduated from the University of Virginia in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in French language and literature. His desire to become a physician brought him to PVCC, where he has been refreshing and enhancing his scientific knowledge prior to applying to medical schools. An honors program participant, he has high praise for his academic experiences at the college, citing the excellence of the faculty and their genuine concern for students. Mr. Taylor's professors, in their turn, cite the academic talent and curiosity of their pupil as well as his willingness to share his knowledge with fellow students.

Beyond the classroom, Mr. Taylor has been very involved in college life. He is a student representative to the College Advisory Council and served on the committee which planned the inauguration of President Friedman last fall. He is a member of the Science Club and treasurer of the Alpha Epsilon Tau chapter of PTK. His willingness to volunteer has benefited many college organizations. This spring, for example, he participated in the PVCC Alumni Association phonathon.

A resident of Madison County, Mr. Taylor is active in community life. He is the director of youth ministry at Mount Pisgah Baptist Church and last year was an aide for the campaign of Michael Sharman for delegate in the Virginia General Assembly.

Medical school is the next step for Mr. Taylor. As he looks to the application process, his goal is to return to the University of Virginia. He plans to specialize in oncology because "I want to be actively involved in the search to eradicate cancer."

# DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD

### RONALD H. J. LANGMAN Associate in Science, General Studies Magna cum laude, Class of 1978

Ronald H. J. Langman, who graduated from PVCC in 1978, is honored today as the recipient of the 2000 Distinguished Alumni Award. Established by the PVCC Alumni Association in 1998 and first presented at last year's commencement ceremony, the award recognizes personal or professional accomplishments of PVCC alumni. It was created to call public attention to the significant roles PVCC alumni are playing in Central Virginia communities and beyond.

Mr. Langman is the president of Branchlands Corporation, which built and manages Branchlands Retirement Village in Charlottesville. As president, he is committed to providing services and promoting an atmosphere of sharing and caring in the community. He has been a builder and owner of RVC Homes, which has built more than 350 homes in the Charlottesville regional market.

His community service at the present includes Hospice of the Piedmont and the National Brain Tumor Association. He lectures on aging and retirement issues and is working on a book on aging in America. He has worked in the past with the Charlottesville Regional Chamber of Commerce, the Charlottesville Board of Realtors, the Thomas Jefferson Area United Way, the YMCA, and the Blue Ridge Home Builders Association.

In recognizing this native of the Netherlands, the PVCC Alumni Association also is paying tribute to its founding president. Mr. Langman was a member of the group of alumni who worked together in the early 1990s to organize the association. He was elected to serve as its first president in 1995-96. His work with the association provided a way for him to reconnect with the place where he found focus and direction, he said in an interview several years ago. PVCC prepared him well for continuing study at the University of Virginia, where he earned baccalaureate and master's degrees in the history of religions, and for the career which followed, he said.

Mr. Langman and his wife, Linda, are the parents of two young children.

# THE ACADEMIC REGALIA

The history of academic dress reaches back to medieval universities, where the gown, the cap, and the hood signified the privileges and responsibilities of the scholar. The teaching guild was the guild of the master of arts; the bachelor was the apprentice of the master.

At Cambridge and Oxford universities, every detail of academic dress is subject to regulation by the university. At one time, Oxford tailors who did not comply with the rules could be punished by the vice chancellor of the university. European universities continue to show great diversity in academic dress. American colleges and universities, however, have followed a single standard of academic dress since 1895.

The gown has become a symbol of the democracy of scholarship as it covers dress indicating rank or social standing. Bachelor's and master's degree gowns have no trimming; the doctor's degree gown is faced with velvet and has velvet bars on the sleeves in colors to show the faculty or discipline to which the degree pertains.

The cap symbolizes freedom of scholarship. The symbol derives from Roman times when freed slaves had the privilege of wearing a cap. Academic caps feature a tassel indicating the discipline of the wearer.

The hood is the forerunner to the present cap. Its colors denote the discipline represented by the degree, and the college or university from which the degree was granted.

# THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The Piedmont Virginia Community College mace was presented to the college by University of Virginia President Robert M. O'Neil in 1988. The gift honored PVCC President George B. Vaughan as he prepared to leave the college and also signified the close working relationship that had developed between the two institutions.

The mace is a traditional ceremonial staff which serves as a symbol of authority. The PVCC mace is made of silver and walnut and incorporates a Jefferson cup into its design. It was created by John J. Owen, retired vice president for development at the University of Virginia.
